



Maîtres Vignerons de la Presqu'île de St Tropez Romain Desbastides

Vineyard

The Master Vignerons of the Presqu'île de Saint-Tropez have been established since 1964. This group was born from the initiative of eight winegrowers wishing to create a collective marketing site and to promote their wines. The entity brings together 10 estates and 3 large cellars on the most beautiful terroirs of Provence. It is the leading producer of Côtes de Provence. For more than 50 years, their vines have benefited from an exceptional location and the best sunshine in France. Surrounded by the sea, they extend from the hills of Gassin to the beaches of Ramatuelle.

Winemaking

The plots are checked once a week to pick at perfect maturity. The harvest is done exclusively at night between 4 a.m. and 9 a.m. to preserve the aromatic potential of the grapes. Direct pressing of the grapes away from oxygen is followed by fermentation at low temperatures and aging on fine lees to impart richness and complexity.

Tasting

This rosé is pale, with a floral nose, with notes of small red fruits. The palate is fresh, tender, with citrus notes.

Grape variety: 42% Cinsault, 19% Carignan, 17% Mourvèdre, 14% Grenache, 5% Others, 3% Syrah

Taste and Flavor: Lively and dry

Alcohol content: 13°

Allergen: Sulphites

Service advice

Serve it at 8°C as an aperitif with tapenade, Provençal dishes such as pissaladière, shellfish, crustaceans or other seafood dishes. It will also go well with poultry or pork.
