



Château de Bouscassé Madiran

Château Bouscassé is an estate belonging to the Brumont family for several generations. It comprises 50 hectares of large clay-limestone terroir along the cliff of the commune of Maumusson-Laguian. This terroir is also nicknamed "Le Pied de Côte de Saint-Emilion" with humor, because the Tannat produces a wine which has certain characteristics similar to the great wines of the right bank of Bordeaux: rigor, fine structure and long aging potential. guard.

Grape varieties

Tannat, Cabernet-Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc Vines 20 to 100 years old

Terroir

Fine variegated yellow and white clays resting on stone cracked limestone.
Reasoned control, natural compost.

Winemaking and Aging Maceration of 3 to 6 weeks Fermentation at 28°C
Aging in barrels, 30% to 50% new

Tasting comments

Harmony in power, a delicate fruitiness with aromas of blackberries with well-integrated tannins and a fleshy palate. It is a wine which remains young, with a slow evolution and therefore a good aging potential.

Food and wine pairings

Red meats, spicy dishes. Gascon, Béarnaise and Basque.
